4. Методические материалы, определяющие процедуры оценивания результатов обучения, характеризующих этапы формирования компетенций

Формой отчетности по дисциплине «Иностранный язык» является зачет без оценки в первом семестре и зачет с оценкой в третьем семестре

Критерии оценки:

при выставлении оценки учитывается уровень владения языковой компетенцией (языковая корректность, лексическое и структурное разнообразие, фонетическое оформление речи), речевой компетенцией (композицией речи, степень связности); социолингвистической и социокультурной компетенцией (адекватность выбора языкового и речевого материала с учетом всех компонентов культурно-маркированной ситуации, знание культурных реалий родной страны и страны изучаемого языка.

«отлично» – свободно владеет лексическим материалом, предусмотренным программой, включающим определенный набор межъязыковых стандартных соответствий (термины, клише, фразеологизмы, устойчивые словосочетания и т.п.), пригодных для использования в типовых контекстах; использует различные синтаксические конструкции; интонирование соответствует литературной норме; допускаются 1-3 незначительные ошибки, самостоятельно исправленные;

– речь отличается четкой структурой; демонстрирует умение устанавливать логические связи;

– в устном и письменном переводе соблюдает нормы, обнаруживает достаточные знания реалий иноязычной культуры;

«хорошо» – в целом владеет словарным запасом программных тем, но допускает неточности в употреблении лексических единиц; использует разнообразные синтаксические конструкции, но не в полном объеме; речь в целом грамотна, но иногда встречаются негрубые грамматические ошибки (артикли, неправильное грамматическое оформление идиоматических выражений) – не более 5; небольшие отклонения от произносительных норм;

– иногда допускает нарушения в построении композиции высказывания; имеются отдельные недостатки в использовании средств логической связи;

«удовлетворительно» – демонстрирует ограниченный запас слов, в некоторых случаях недостаточный для выполнения поставленной задачи; в речи допускает ошибки, в целом не препятствующие пониманию,

"неудовлетворительно" выставляется студенту, обнаружившему пробелы в знаниях основного учебно-программного материала, допустившему принципиальные ошибки в выполнении предусмотренных программой заданий.

A drug-smuggling cop who helped run a heroin-trafficking ring and tried to squirm her way out of an arrest by claiming she was “on the job” was found guilty by a federal jury. Yessenia Jimenez, 32, and her boyfriend, Luis Soto, used her Bronx apartment as a stash house, where they kept kilos of heroin, fentanyl and cocaine they brought into the U.S. from Mexico, along with hundreds of thousands of dollars in drug money, prosecutors said. She dealt the drugs in New York and Boston, but her operation came crashing down in January 2018, when Soto’s phone number showed up on phone records of a drug trafficking suspect from Queens. In March 2018, after she and Soto found members of joint DEA and NYPD task force waiting outside their home after they returned from a trip to Massachusetts to meet a heroin trafficker. The handle of her NYPD-issue Glock 9-mm. was sticking out of her purse, which was stuffed

with \$25,000 cash. She told the task force agents she was “on the job,” which prosecutors took to mean she was claiming she was on official police business. Soto and four other members of her operation pleaded guilty. Jimenez was convicted after a one-week trial in Manhattan federal court. Jimenez, who was assigned to patrol city housing developments in the South Bronx, joined the NYPD in 2015. “Simply put, Jimenez was a drug dealer in a cop’s uniform,” U.S. Attorney Geoffrey Berman said. Jimenez faces a mandatory minimum sentence of 10 years behind bars, and a possible maximum life sentence.

Transforming the NY city’s criminal justice system has a price. Overtime at the Department of Probation grew nearly 600% in just six years as the city moves to reduce its jail population and implement criminal justice reforms. The city shelled out \$3.2 million for probation employees in 2018 fiscal year, six times what the agency spent in 2014, when overtime cost just under \$462,911, according to a Daily News. Officials attributed the dramatic increase to Mayor de Blasio’s efforts to decrease the inmate population at city jails and eventually close Rikers Island. Recent state legislation raising the age of criminal responsibility to 18 years old is also to blame. “When you talk about criminal justice reform, everything my members do is that,” Powell said. “Instead of getting sentenced to a criminal justice facility, people get sentenced to probation.” The probation department supervises convict people whom a judge believes can avoid prison or jail, cutting down the number of inmates significantly adds to the agency’s workload. The city’s average inmate population plummeted from 10,240 in 2015 to 7,938 in 2019 fiscal year, records show. De Blasio has moved to close Rikers Island by 2026, replacing the troubled complex with four smaller borough-based jails that will cost about \$8.7 billion. Closing Rikers is possible in part because the NYPD is arresting fewer people – which caused an 18% decrease in adult and juvenile pre-sentence investigations conducted by probation workers. The department’s caseload also dropped from 55,000 in 2014 to 50,000 last fiscal year, when the number of probation officers grew from 518 to 631.

A 300-pound Pennsylvania woman who killed her boyfriend by hitting him with a table leg, then sitting on him has pleaded guilty to third-degree murder. Windi Thomas allegedly told police she had been drinking and craving crack cocaine when she smothered 120-pound Keeno Butler during an altercation in March. The cause of death was “respiratory insufficiency secondary to blunt force trauma to the neck and thoracic compression, exacerbated by blunt force trauma to the head,” according to Goerie.com. Thomas will be in court Dec. 21 for sentencing. Prosecutors are recommending the woman spend 18 to 36 years behind bars. Both Thomas and Butler were 44 at the time of the incident. Had Thomas been found guilty by a jury, she could have been incarcerated for 40 years. “It’s a good result based upon the facts of the case,” Thomas’ court-appointed lawyer, Mark Del Duca told reporters. “I think it’s fair for both sides.” The victim’s sister, Sandra Butler, thought Thomas’ got a light sentence for killing her brother. “She deserved life,” Butler said. Police investigators said that Thomas also slashed Butler across his hand with a knife before sitting on him, with her head pressing against the sofa for leverage. After the murder, Butler reportedly called 911 and confessed that she killed someone.

The 2017 Global Estimate of Modern Slavery, Forced Labor and Forced Marriage report estimates that 40 million people were victims of modern slavery in any given day in 2016. Out of these, approximately 25m people were in forced labor and another 15m people were in a forced marriage. Foreign estimates say around 136,000 individuals are trapped in some form of enslavement across the UK, and the average age of an identified victim of trafficking is 26 years old (at the time of assistance). Half of those identified are between 18 and 34 years old. The average age of victims identified in 2015–2016 was 29 years old. Male victims are being, on average, older than female victims. At least 16 per cent of identified victims in the same period were children. On average, a victim is trafficked for approximately two years, therefore the average age of entry into trafficking is below 26 years. In 2002-2016, the proportion of identified cases of trafficking in the UK for sexual exploitation has declined, while the share of identified cases of trafficking for forced labor has increased. The vast majority of victims identified between 2002 and 2016 entered the trafficking process through labor migration, although a large share of identified child victims in 2014–2016 were sold by their families or entered the trafficking process through family or relatives. Victims identified in sectors like mining and construction are almost exclusively men, while victims identified in prostitution and sectors such as hospitality are mostly women.

Nine African and Asian crew were taken off a pair of British scallop trawlers in Portsmouth in December 2017 as suspected victims of modern slavery, and two skippers, one from Scotland and the second from Merseyside, were detained by police. There were alleged cases of suspected slavery involving migrant labour in Scotland and southern England in 2017, 2014 and 2012. In December 2016, a gangmaster couple who supplied workers to catch chickens on farms producing eggs for major supermarkets agreed to a settlement of one million pounds for compensation and legal costs for the migrant workers they had exploited. These individuals were not paid minimum wage, had deductions made from their wages, were made to live in squalid conditions, and were threatened or assaulted for complaining. The Global Slavery Index estimates that there were 136,000 people living in modern slavery in the United Kingdom (UK) on any given day in 2016, reflecting a prevalence rate of 2.1 victims for every thousand people in the country. But research conducted by the UK Home Office in 2014 estimated that there are between 10,000 to 13,000 potential victims of modern slavery in the UK. The top five nationalities of potential victims of modern slavery recorded in 2017 were UK nationals, Albanian, Vietnamese, Chinese, and Nigerian. These figures, of course, do not

Rikers Island is a 167.204 ha island in the East River between Queens and the Bronx that is home to New York City's main jail complex. It is close to the runways of LaGuardia Airport. The island is home to one of the world's largest correctional institutions and mental institutions, and has been described as New York's most famous jail. The complex, operated by the New York City Department of Correction, has a budget of \$860 million a year, a staff of 9,000 officers and 1,500 civilians managing 100,000 admissions per year and an average daily population of 10,000 inmates. Approximately 85% of those detained at Rikers Island have not been convicted of a crime. Detainees include pretrial defendants, either held without bail or remanded in custody. The rest of the population have been convicted and are serving short sentences. According to a study done in 2015 by the Vera Institute of Justice, it costs the city approximately \$209,000 to detain one person for one year at Rikers Island. It has a reputation for abuse and neglect of inmates, attracting increased media and judicial scrutiny that has resulted in numerous rulings against the New York City government. It is also notorious for numerous assaults by inmates on

uniformed and civilian staff, resulting in often serious injuries. In May 2013, Rikers Island ranked as one of the ten worst correctional facilities in the United States, based on reporting in Mother Jones magazine.

The West Virginia woman who compared then-First Lady Michelle Obama to an “ape in heels” is heading to jail. On May 30, 2019 Pamela Taylor was sentenced to 10 months in the slammer for embezzling more than \$18,000 in FEMA disaster relief, according to MetroNews. Taylor, 57, admitted to misappropriating the cash after claiming she was compelled to abandon her flooded Clay County home and move into a rental unit. But officials discovered that not only hadn’t she moved but was stilling residing in her undamaged home. In December 2016, Taylor was fired as a Clay County Development Corp. director after penning the disparaging Obama post on Facebook. Referencing Melania Trump’s impending White House tenure, Taylor wrote, “It will be so refreshing to have a classy, beautiful, dignified First Lady back in the White House. I’m tired of seeing a Ape in heels.” After her Facebook posting received overwhelming rebukes, Taylor attempted a half-hearted mea culpa. Although she apologized “to any one individual that took offense to my post,” she tried justifying it by claiming she was “entitled to my own opinion, as afforded under the Constitution of the United States; as well as every citizen of this country.” As part of her plea agreement, Taylor has already forked over \$18,000 in restitution and will pay a \$10,000 fine. Once out of prison, she will serve three years of supervised release, reported TV station WCHS. “There’s no such thing as a little bit of FEMA fraud,” said U.S. Attorney Mike Stuart. “Taylor’s fraudulent scheme took FEMA dollars away from those who needed it the most.”

A Pennsylvania couple drew the “bank error not in your favor” card and went directly to jail after getting arrested for spending money that was deposited into their account by their bank by accident. September 8,

2019 Pennsylvania state police investigators said Robert and Tiffany Williams of Montoursville, in the central part of the state, accidentally had \$120,000 deposited into their account at BB&T on May 31, 2019 after a teller made a mistake. However, instead of notifying the bank, the couple went on a spending spree, blowing their windfall on things like a new SUV (sport utility vehicle) and four-wheel off-road vehicles in less than three weeks. The couple also gave money to friends and paid for bills and for car repairs, investigators said. After BB&T noticed its mistake, it transferred the money to the right account and contacted the Williamses and said the couple would have to repay \$107,000. After initial talks, Tiffany Williams said they would work out a payment plan but then the couple cut off communications with the bank. Now they're facing felony theft charges. After their arrest and arraignment, the pair was released on \$25,000 bail. They each face up to seven years in prison.

Mullis' tale began to unravel after a postmortem examination showed six puncture wounds to Amy's back — but the rake had just four tines, reported The Washington Post. As authorities became more skeptical of his story, Mullis, 43, was arrested for first-degree murder. "He hoped people would feel sorry for him and not ask for any more questions," asserted Iowa state prosecutor Marie Hughes. After Amy's 13-year-old son discovered his mother's corpse, his dad called it a freak accident. Court testimony revealed that the Mullis' marriage was less than mirthful. Shortly before Amy's demise, friends claimed the victim confided that she was ready to leave Todd. Amy's brother testified that her friends referred to her as "P.O.T." — prisoner of Todd, due to the husband's alleged dominating ways. Hughes suggested that Mullis was upset with the notion of potentially losing his 39-year-old wife — not to mention, half of his acreage in a divorce. It wasn't the first time that he felt threatened, according to Amy's friends. They claimed she was involved in a previous affair that Todd discovered. When he confronted his cheating wife, she reportedly told pals she feared for her life. "Being a farmer means everything to him. He has put his life into that farm," explained Hughes. "The defendant had to find a way to keep his farm."

“Raging Bull” star Robert De Niro is worth over a half-billion dollars, an attorney said June 6, 2019 as the famous actor spars with his estranged wife over the terms of their divorce. The new details about the Hollywood star’s finances emerged during a hearing in Manhattan Supreme Court that revealed the two are battling over how to interpret a 2004 pre-nuptial agreement signed after a previous divorce. “Ms. Hightower has taken the position, 'Nope, I’m entitled to 50%,” Judge Matthew Cooper said. “We are not talking about hundreds of thousands — we are talking millions of dollars here.” De Niro attorney Krauss-Browne said that under the terms of the pre-nup Hightower was entitled to a \$6 million apartment, \$500,000 cash, \$1 million each year and half the value of their marital residence. Hightower claims to earn only \$15,000 a year, Krauss-Browne said. Hightower, 64, is arguing she is entitled to much more — and that De Niro, 75, has kept her in the dark about their money since 2008. She believes she is entitled to a cut of 38 movies and 35 new business ventures since 2004 that involved the Oscar-winning actor. Hightower attorney Allan Mantel put the couple’s revenue since their pre-nup at \$300 million — \$250 million of which came from movies. He estimated that De Niro’s net worth was \$500 million. In addition to De Niro’s work in Hollywood, much of their earnings came from his ownership of the Nobu chain of restaurants and Greenwich Hotel. De Niro filed for divorce from Hightower in December 2018. They are also battling over custody of their 7-year-old daughter, who they had through a surrogate. They also have a 21-year-old son.

California authorities uncovered a criminal gang of 19 people who taught visiting Chinese how to obtain American citizenship. A 41-year-old Chinese woman, Dongyuan Li, reportedly owned "You Win USA Vacation Services Corp". As part of their business, training services were provided to “hide” their pregnancy before the customs service, as well as training for interviews at the Embassy in China. The main emphasis was on "birthright citizenship." As investigators found out, a woman received, on average, from 60 thousand dollars for the “successful” birth of a Chinese child in the United States, thereby making the newborn a US citizen. In the criminal schemes of this organization, issuing American citizenship to a newborn was only the first step. After giving birth, Dongyuan Li talked about how to get all the “bonuses” as Chinese with a child-US citizen, as this facilitated the immigration route for parents. In total, investigators discovered remittances worth more than three million dollars. Over the several years of its existence, more than five hundred Chinese women have passed through this company. With the money earned, Dongyuan Li and her husband managed to buy an estate worth more than \$ 2 million

and many expensive cars. According to the prosecution, the fraudster was offered a deal in which Li would be required to shop on all her accomplices and go to jail for 15 years. Also, the leader of the gang will be fined about \$ 2 million, including the seizure of cars and house property. According to authorities, most members of the criminal gang are currently hiding from justice, many have fled back to China.

Detective Constable Chris Gibson of Abingdon CID said: “These men made multiple attempts to steal a cash machine and their failed attempts were captured on CCTV. “I am pleased with these convictions which take two criminals off the streets of Oxfordshire and will hopefully provide them with an opportunity to consider other paths in life other than theft.”

Gueorguieva, who claims she was once Mr Winner's lover, admitted to police she deliberately stole items of sentimental value to the widow including a picture of the late film director, hoping to cause her "maximum distress". Mrs Winner said she pointed out she had 20,000 euros in her handbag and handed over the code to her safe in a bid to end the ordeal, but Gueorguieva still carried out a lengthy search of her home. When Gueorguieva turned to leave, she said: "Don't ring the police otherwise you will have to look over your shoulder for the rest of your life", the court heard. Gueorguieva, a Bulgarian-British national, was captured earlier this year when she tried to sell one of the stolen items, a Bulgari watch, to an undercover police officer for £6,500. Prosecutor Mark Gadsden said she eventually admitted being behind the raid, and confessed she had planned it for two years out of revenge.

Horrifying footage shows the moment a thug used a machete to attack three men in broad daylight on the streets of London. Dominic Cummins, 21, was sentenced to eight years in prison on Tuesday following the assault in Tower Hamlets in May 2018. In the video he can be seen driving a moped past a car at a junction before he stops, pulls out a machete and runs at the car. After two people run away from the vehicle, Cummins then goes face to face with another one of the passengers and swings the large blade. The video stops as Cummins stands over the other individual with his blade held high. The man on the ground was left suffering with significant blood loss after being slashed on the head, chest and arms, but managed to drive away in the car. Cummins also fled but he was later arrested by the Metropolitan Police. The 21-year-old, who lived in Tower Hamlets, was found guilty of attempted grievous bodily harm with intent and possession of an offensive weapon at Snaresbrook Crown Court last month. Detective Constable Andrew Bray, of the Met’s Central East CID, said: “This was a vicious attack and the victim is extremely lucky to walk away with his life. Cummins carried out this brutal attack in broad daylight, leaving passers-by fleeing in panic and in fear for their own lives. “Cummins is a violent individual and I’m grateful to the jury and witnesses for helping us to secure this conviction.”

Ren was sentenced to 12 years for manslaughter, 6 years for facilitating illegal immigration.
